My dear Beverley

It was my intention to send you a few lines immediately on our return, but the influenza assailed us both, in the City, before we could reach our quiet home - My son wishes me to accompany him to Washington - then there can be no difficulty in your receiving the package -

Inclosed I send you one of my treasures - a letter from your noble, generous, benevolent father - I was honored by many such - The public mind seldom cares about separating truth from falsehood, and I ardently wish that immediate measures should be adopted to shew that the most infamous libel has not a shadow of truth - Tudor was indeed horribly base to have it copied and left in the hands of a wretch capable of bringing it to light - I have never seen it - and only heard it mentioned by Mr. Hackley, professor Tucker and Charles King - before our departure I will write again - the influenza nearly terminated my mortal career -
