Dear Sir

I received your Letter of the 25<sup>th</sup> inst  
this morning, covering several others.

The letter ~~from~~<sup>to</sup> the French Minister  
has been shewn to Mr Rush who has readily under-  
taken to do what you promised the Minister he  
wants to do. For this purpose Mr de Beauville's letters were  
left with him - as soon as he returns, these copies  
will be sent to Mr Lee as you direct.

I will prepare a ~~document~~<sup>document</sup> off tomorrow  
a letter to Mr Jones the Consul at Tripoli. Much  
fear we shall be persuded to give him a Credit  
in London. or to take up his Drafts here for our  
Funds have nearly all been sent to the Bankers.
