Dear Sir

Mr Whiskolm, who attends to the  
suits in Augusta, has decided to go to Lou-  
-dow, & accompany Mr Skinner &  
Mr Mousseau, over to the Court at Staun-  
-ton. He will deliver you this, & I wish  
you to go with him, to those gentlemen,  
& by them to set out immediately,  
as the trial comes on, on Tuesday next.  
If they have set out, inform Mr Whisk-  
-olm the road they took, that he may  
follow them. If they have not gone  
& want a horse or other aid, furnish  
it, as the cause will now be tried &  
there will be an end of the business,  
& I have little doubt, in my favour.  
I hope that every thing goes on well  
with you. I expect the house will be

finished, so as to be ready to receive us, when  
we come over which will be <sup>at</sup> soon, as I heard  
that you are prepared.

We began sowing wheat to day, the first  
of the kind. It is rolled in lime, & will be  
plashed when it comes up. It is pre-  
viously soaked in salt & water 12. hours  
This is done to protect it against the  
mice; it succeeded wherever it was  
sown in this neighborhood last year.

I have great confidence in your pro-  
sperity & forward every part of your busi-  
ness, in which I am so deeply inter-  
ested.
