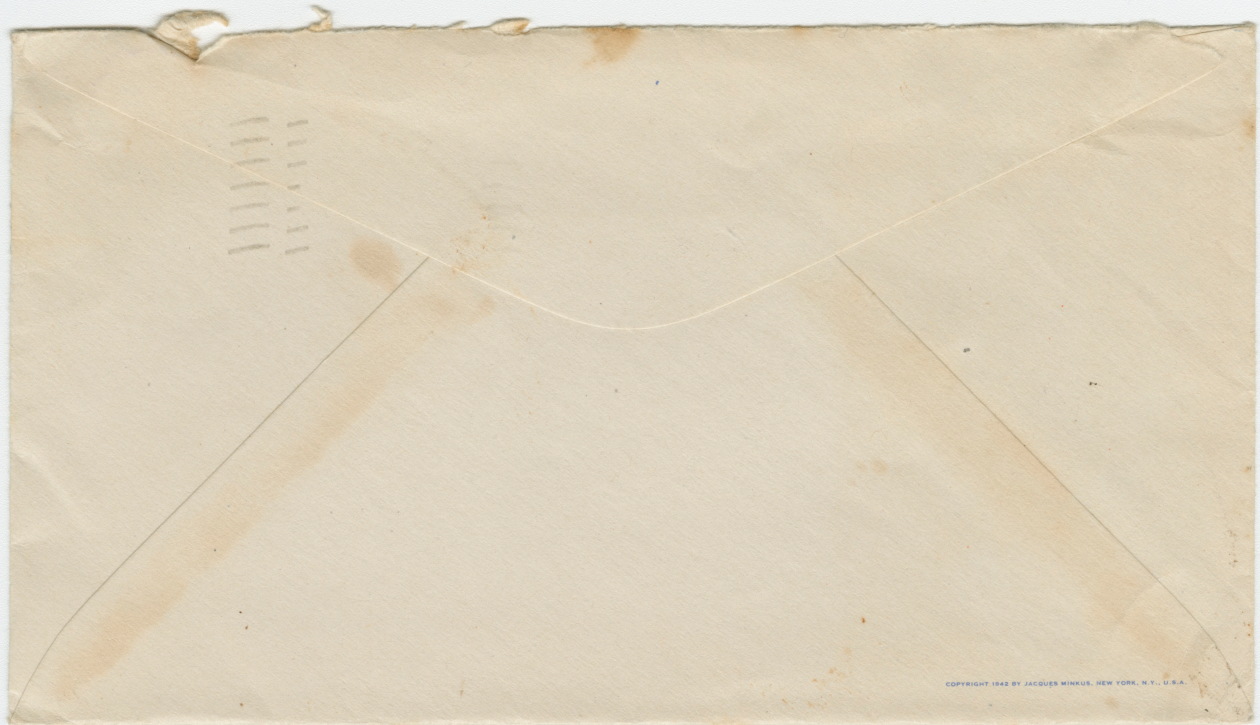
Darling I'll say good night until tomorrow may God bless you + keep you darling for me.
