the corner from the school.

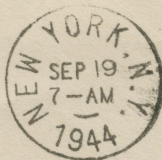
I seen two swell pictures. One was

belongs. Isn't this a cruel world.

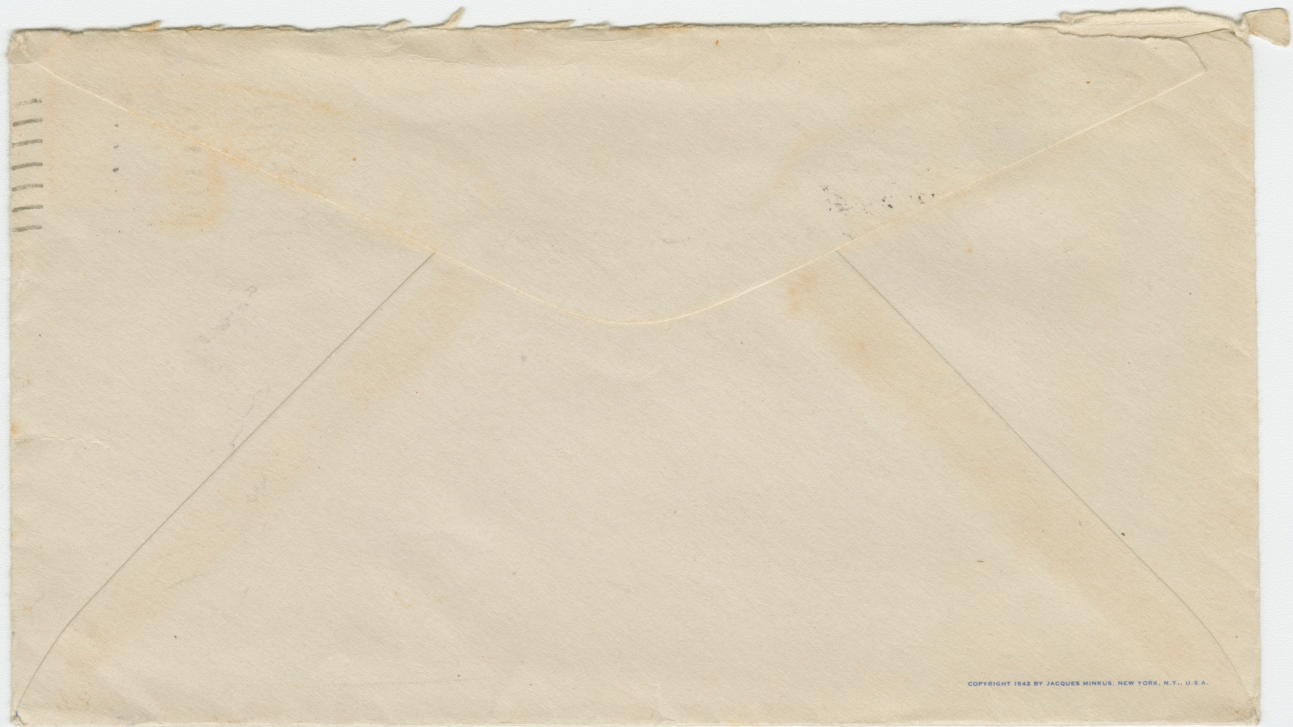
Have isn't home yet. He went out with
