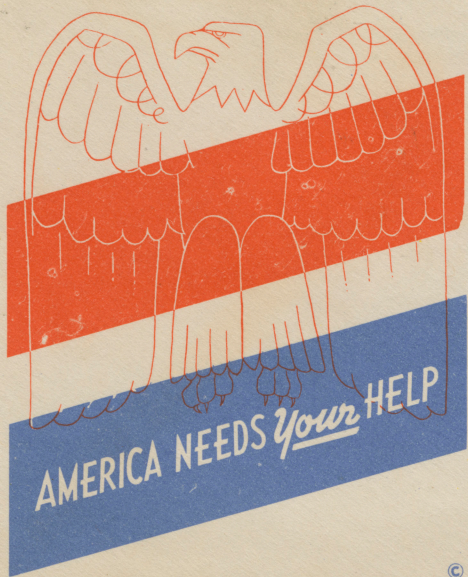
was time for school. This week I have
