it.

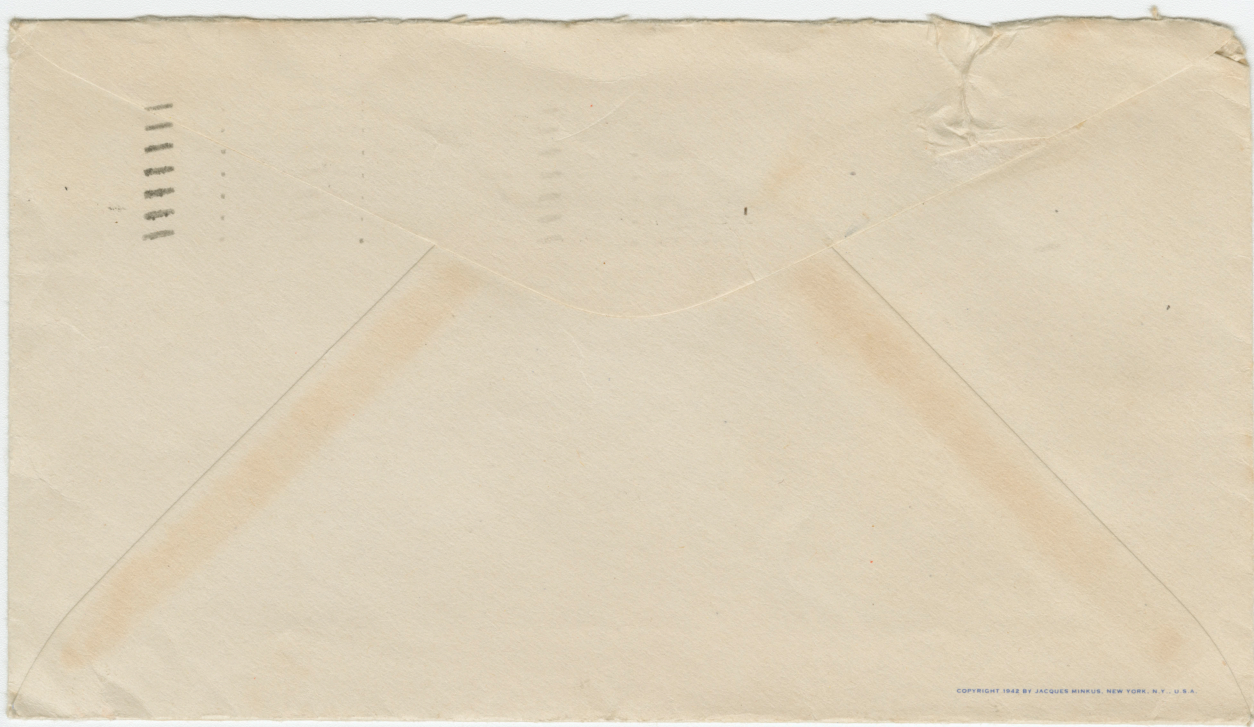
Today I boned a leg of lamb + made
