~~Am~~ A letter
of Genl. Pope to Gen. Cox, captured by
Genl. Stuart's Cavalry a few days ago,
directs Cox to ~~send~~ retain 5000 men in
Western Va. & to send the rest by river &
Rail Road to ~~Gen~~ Pope. On the 16th
of Aug. Cox telegraphed from Gauley
Bridge that his command would be at
Parkersburg on the evening of the 20th.
We have heard that he reached Park-
ersburg about that time. Cox's whole
force on the Kanawha & is about six
thousand men, divided on both
sides of New River.

The Comd Genl
wishes you, so soon as you have
moved your train & baggage, loaded
with stores, ahead of you & in this
direction, to move your command
& the Cavalry ~~under~~ Genl Jenkins,
now temporarily commanded by you,
to Red House.

You will command the Cavalry, in
Genl Jenkins absence to scout
toward Ft. Pleasant, Selach Falls
& Harperswood; provide yourself with
all ~~the~~ necessary facilities
for crossing the River at Red House
as necessity may require.

Major Sulzer reports today a
scouting party of the enemy then or
four hundred strong between Repley
& Harperswood, who are from Parker's Camp,
where the enemy is reported to be
2000 strong.

thirty waggon's loads of ammunition stores left here, during which time he wishes you to operate in front, if it continues to be prudent for you to do so.

On your arrival at Gauley you can supply yourself with hard bread, flour & bacon from this

place. It should not be prudent for

you to remain so long in front inform me by courier.

General,

The Comd Genl wishes me to say
that the Bright wagons ordered from your
Brigade, instead of the twenty five previously
ordered, are to stop at ~~Fayette~~ Raleigh
VA instead of coming on to Fayetteville
with a load at the former place (Raleigh)
while they are en route to Parkers Ferry, leaving
a guard with the wagons on left at Perry, &
moving your command to Parkers Ferry as before
ordered. If your wagons have got on this side
of Raleigh take immediate steps to turn
them back to that place & load ^{eight of them} there as
above mentioned. The transportation for the
seed will come on as explained in the Genl's last letter
