Sir

In obedience to your order, I have the honor of submitting the following Report.

On Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> inst. on our march from Camp Wickison to Charlestown, the 36<sup>th</sup> V<sup>a</sup> Regt., was ordered to march in the rear, as a reserve to your command on that day.

On the march from Camp Wickison to Charlestown, nothing of importance occurred with the 36<sup>th</sup> Regt.

We were halted in the upper part of Charlestown, where we remained a short time, and then rec'd. orders to march my Regt. through Charlestown to the hill at Col. Clarkson's residence near Elk River. And whilst there, in compliance with an order, I detached a company from the Regt. to assist in extinguishing the fire there in Charlestown.

We remained there by orders acting as a reserve, until I rec'd. orders to march my Regt. back through town towards the mouth of Elk river, and was stopped near that point, and remained there until after dark that night, when in accordance to orders I marched my Regt. to Camp above Charlestown.

I have no casualties to report.
