Dear Sir

I herby hand
you a statement of facts as
connected with the capture of
M^r William L Ellicott - 49th Va
Col^o with the request that you
will make a demand for his
release

Mr Ellicott was wounded
at the Battle of Seven Pines May
31st 1862 and subsequently disch
arged from the service as being
permanently disabled but in
April last while on his way
from Richmond to visit his
Parant residing in P Williams
Co was remobilized by Lt Graves
at Orange Co Va & furnished
he being unfit for service on

account of the condition of
his left foot - (the effects of the
mound used at Snow Pines) &
proceeded on his way to P^{ro}g^{ress}
arriving at his father's house
near Manassas on Thursday
night 23rd or Friday night 24th
of April last and was captured
the following morning & con-
viced to Washington. Once from
a friend who was a Prisoner
at the time I learn he noticed
^{an account of} his arrival & confinement as
a soldier of the 49th Regt
but in which of the Prisons he was
confined was unable to learn
certainly not at either the Old
Capitol or Carroll Prisons as
my friend was confined in
Each during his imprisonme-
nt
