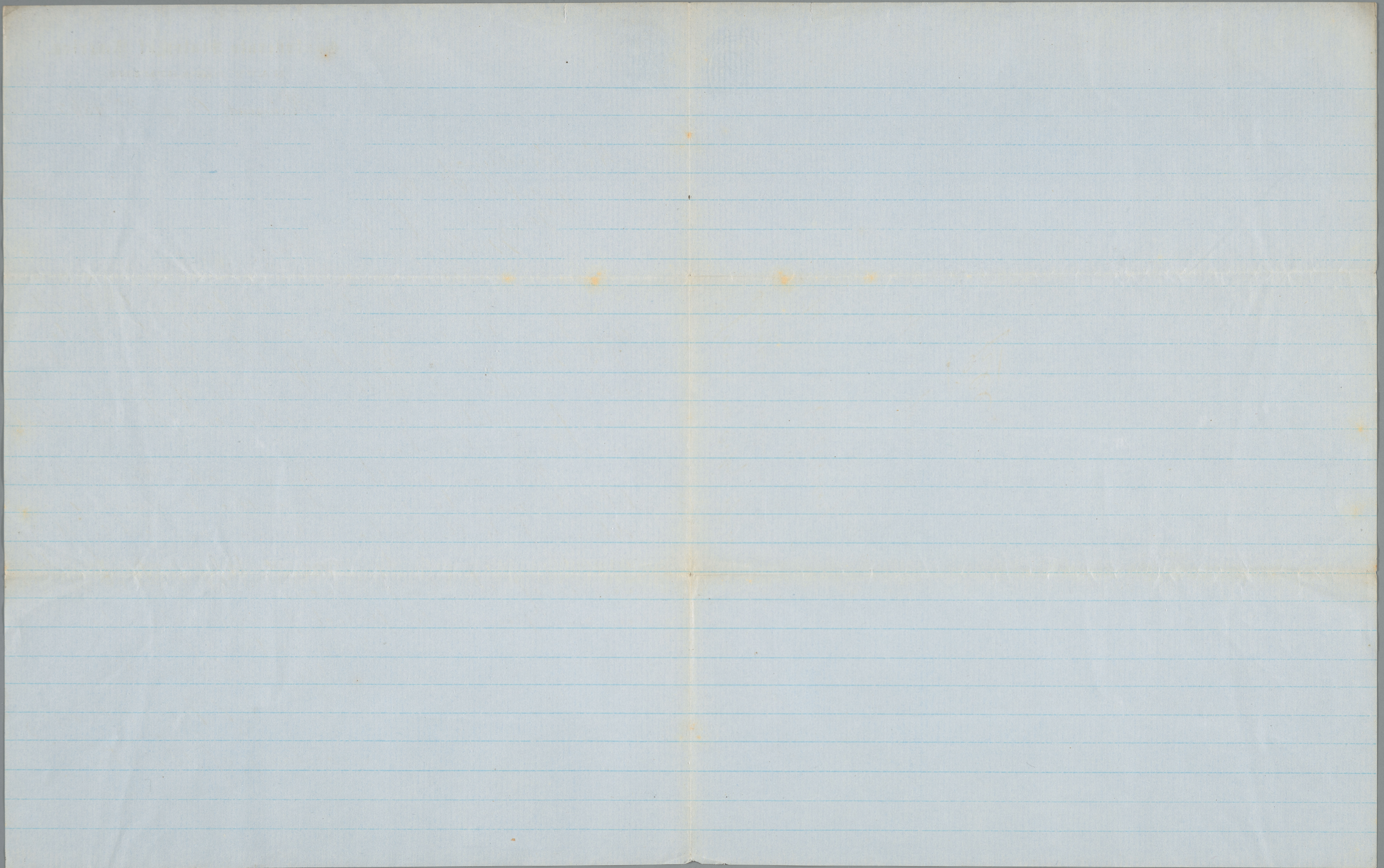
Sir,

I deem it proper to hand you herewith a copy of my instructions to J. G. Miner, an Agent of this Department, who is charged with the duty of procuring iron for plating war vessels on the Savannah river and elsewhere.

The iron on the Brunswick Road, it is believed, may be removed without serious detriment to the public interests, and while it is urgently required by, and is taken up for, the service of the Confederacy, I desire to do all in my power to protect private interests.
