My dear Sir

You will read with interest
& pleasure the enclosed copy of a letter from
Lieut. Col. Campbell who commands the
expedition directed against the Mississippian
way towns. I see no objection to your
causing it to be published for the infor-
mation of the City. The prisoners re-
ported Col. Campbell that he was
within 18 miles of him with 600 warriors.
I fear that our troops may be harassed
on their return - a reinforcement of 80
men was sent here on Sunday from
Greenville to ^{meet} ~~reinforce~~ them.

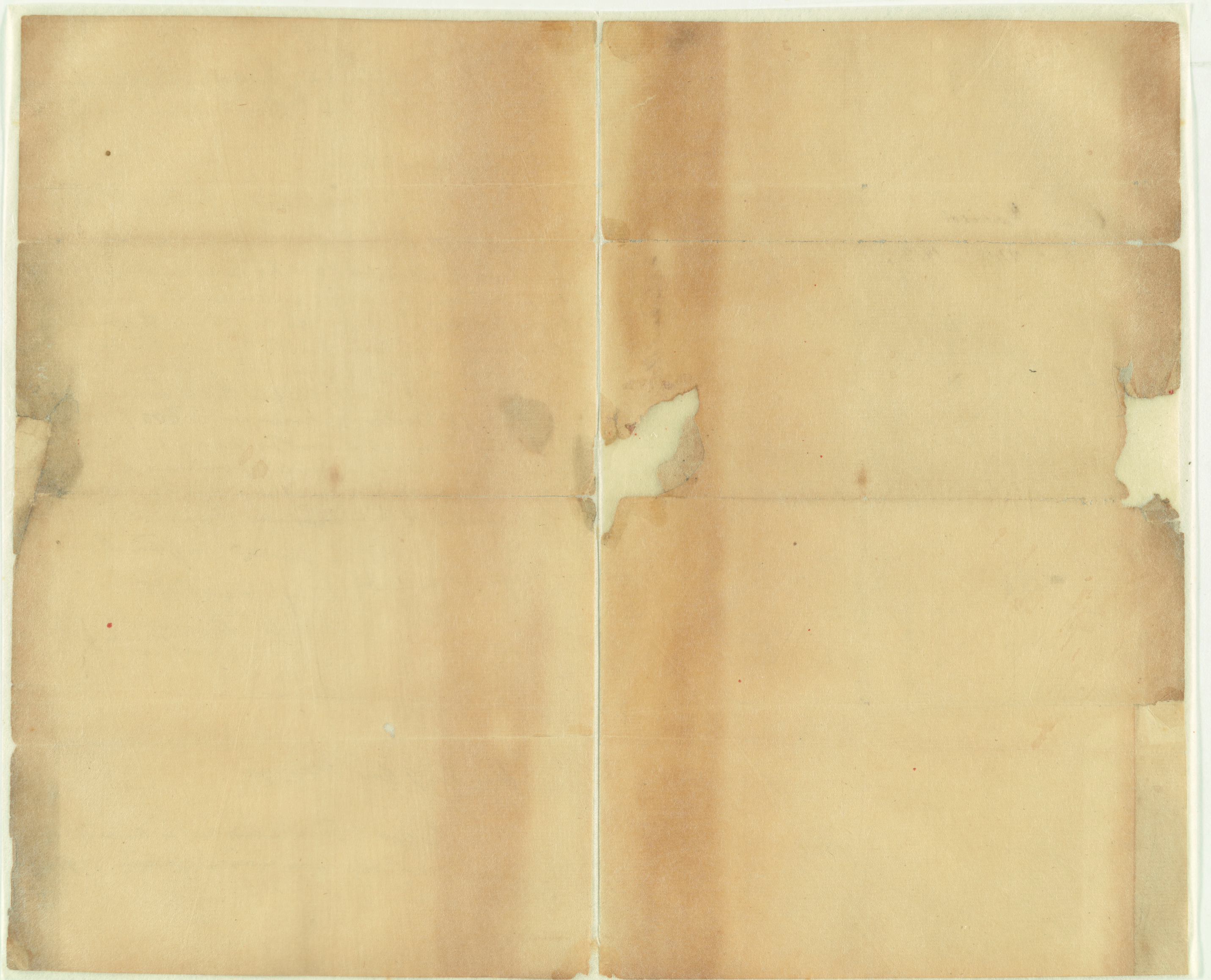

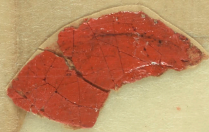
