

Gentlemen, Richmond November 1st 1792.

I beg leave to furnish you with copies of my letter to the Secretary of State and of sundry accompanying papers relative to the southern boundary of this Commonwealth.

I am induced at this time to request your attention to this subject from observing in the proceedings of the House of Representatives a resolution which contemplates a resurvey of Walker's line and of Henderson's line for the purpose, as is declared, of establishing a boundary between the two States.

In my judgement Walker's line has been established already and no measure is necessary or proper on the part of Congress but a confirmation thereof.

From any other decision inconveniences may result to this Commonwealth and the United
