Sunday Night.

Feb. 24, 1918.

My dear folks:

We are off. Got our orders and everything. Haven't got much to say, except that first call is at 2:30 A.M. Breakfast at 3. - Then hit the road. Will not get a chance to send anything now for at least two weeks. Can't know how I am going to get this out, they won't let us out of the Barracks.

Will close now with lots of love and kisses for all. When we get back, we'll have lots of stories to tell and lets hope it won't be too long, for I suppose we'll be just as anxious to get back as we are to get over. Everything is wild here tonight. Can't bear yourself think. "Au revoir"
