Gentlemen,

The College is indebted to me at this time about \$11,500. There is of this amount about 1500\$ due for back interest - I have in my possession a claim due the College by Mr Randolph of Albemarle given me as collateral security - From the best information that I have the claim when realized will not be sufficient to pay me - Six months ago I requested your Bursees to sell the Randolph property. I learn from him in the last week that nothing has been done touching the sale.

I am unwilling under present circumstances in view of the management & state of your financial affairs to wait longer for the payment of my debt - and feel obliged to take steps accordingly.

I hope this communication will have the effect of directing your attention to the true state of the financial ^{condition} of the College.

of the debt is about \$10,000: the interest due and
unpaid about \$2000. I am obliged to require the

of the principal.

Unless speedy & suitable arrangements
are made I shall resort to legal means
to enforce my demand.

The Faculty were informed yesterday
in writing of my determination.

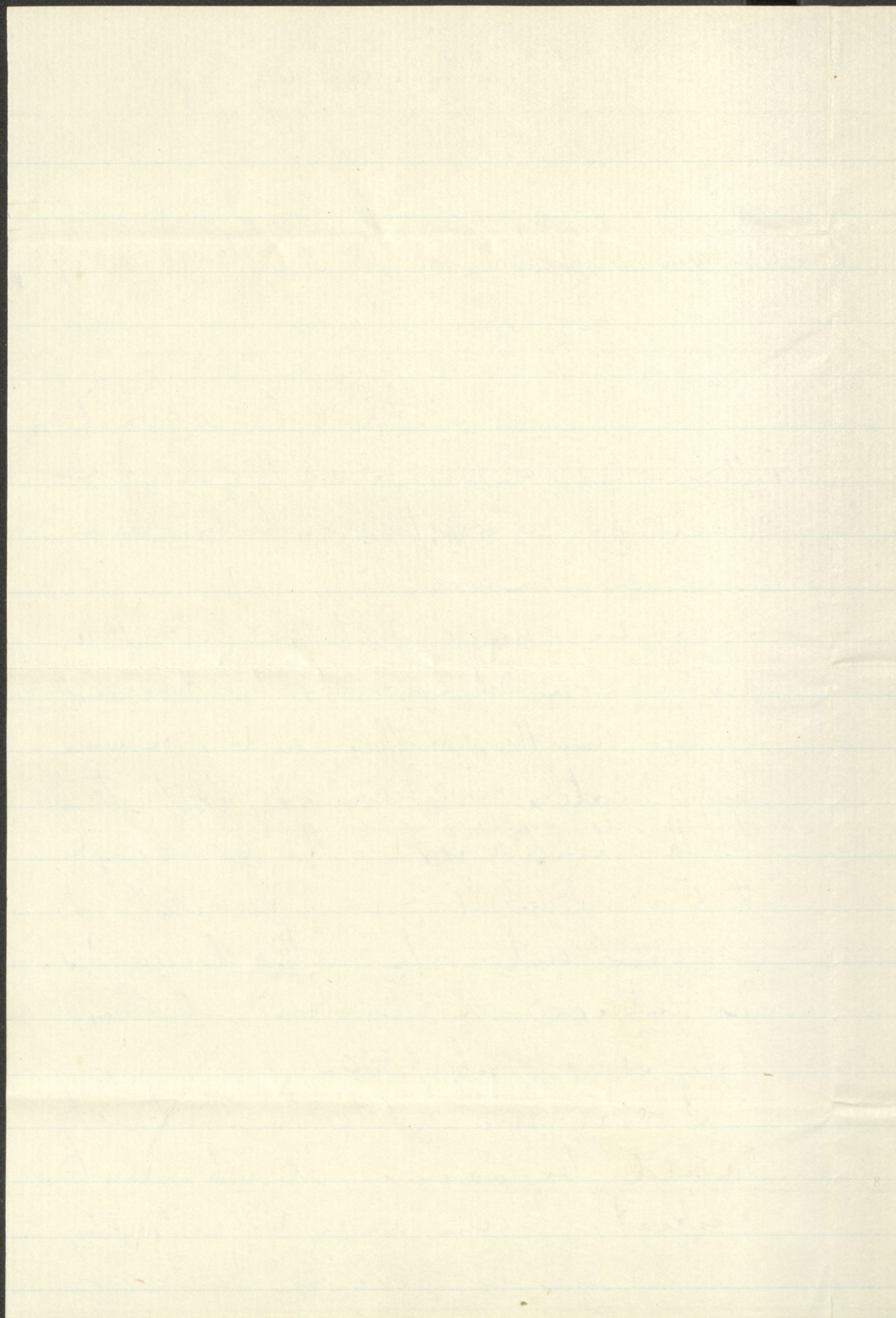

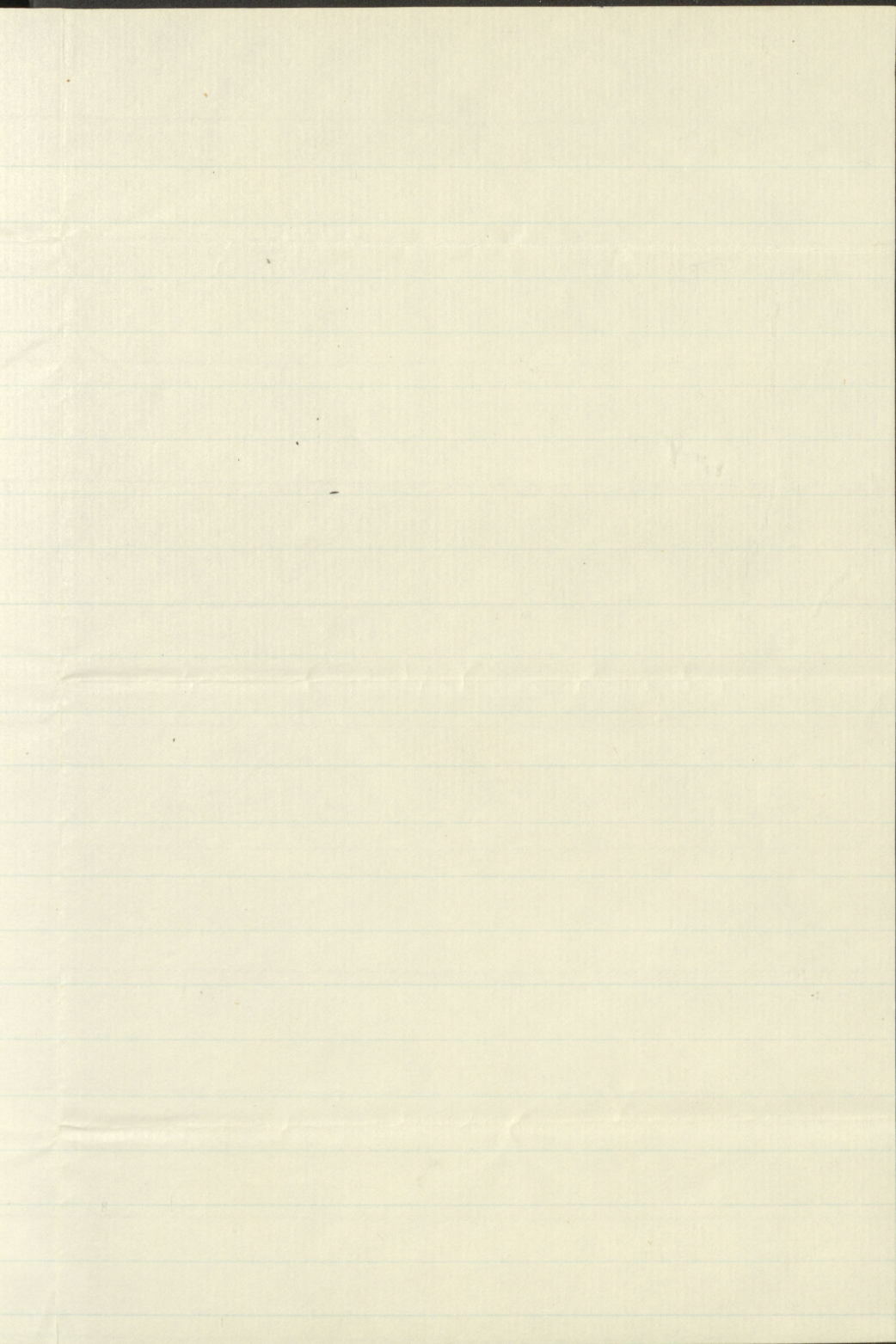
Gentlemen

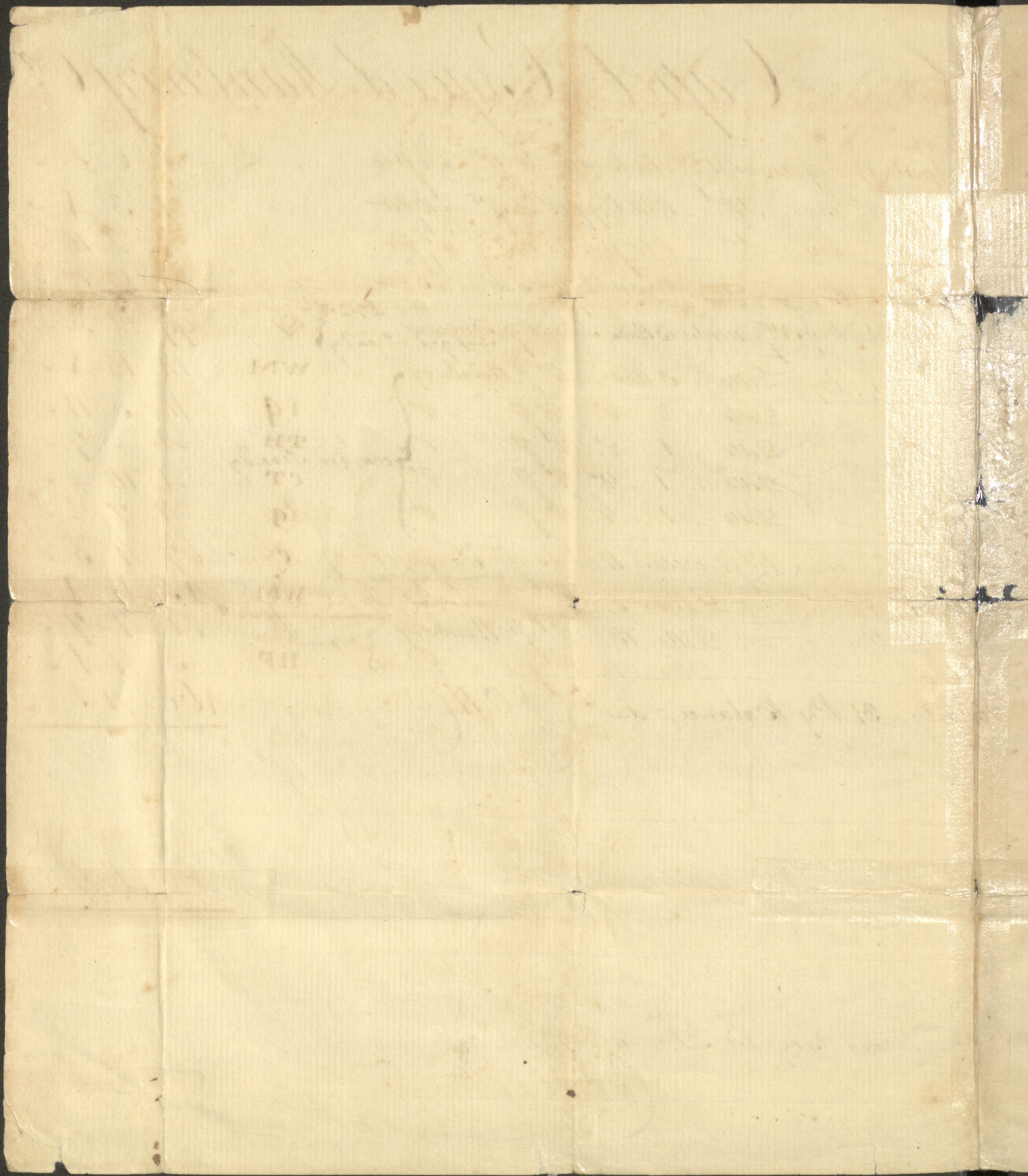

b. This acct. having been neglected to be kept during this period, I did not know but Mr. Nicolson might have some acct. of it, & spoke to him for that purpose, but found he had not. At that time he proposed that an account should be stated charging the College at the same rate of annuum as had been formerly paid for work, which appearing to me very reasonable, I recommended it to my father to do so, & lay the acct. before the Society for their inspection. With regard to the quantum, ~~I am~~ I am a very incompetent judge, but think it my duty to observe, that it appears by the College books, that in the course of about 3 years, to wit, from 25 March 1743 - to 18 Apr. 1746 (before or since which time those books afford no light) my father was partly paid & partly credited the sum of £6.1.7 only - which is but about 40% of An. This I communicated to him, & it would I believe have been the rate he would have governed himself by, if he had not called on his steward (Mr. Chowning) for the acct. of Coopers work done for the College since the time he began to keep it (which I think was about the time when this account ends) & from the amount of that he thought he should injure himself, were he to charge less than £4. . . . of Annum. After having communicated the only facts I am acquainted with. I am to ask the direction of the President & Professors what sum I am to give my father credit for as well on this, as on account of the hire of negroes Nanny, & Will.

x The reason of this credit is this - In an acct. stated in College Books by W. John Groom, & which is exactly balanced at this time - my father had credit for the hire of Manny till now at 5 l. fln. And so it remained without any new agreement till Mr. President Shilk's time, when my father acquainted him that her services were worth more than £5 fln. He had always neglected till then to propose a new agreement, & that unless the College would allow him at the rate of £6. - - a year from the time of his uncle W. Comminsary Blair's death (w^{ch} happened in Apr. 1743) he would hire her out elsewhere - He had never made any agreement himself, but the Comminsary had hired her at £5. - - & after his death she remained without any new bargain. He says Mr. Shilk agreed to this - As therefore he charges at £6. - - the whole time since the Com^y's death for 3 years of w^{ch} he had credit at £5. - - This last credit ought to be reversed, as it is above. This agreement with Mr. President Shilk, I know nothing of my self, & perhaps no other persons know, except my father - I can only say, that I should have thought even £6. - - fln. a moderate hire
