work hounds succeeded in killing one,
below the "White House" Saltburn.

after a good morning's work, succeeded
in getting hold of a brace & running ^{two}
to ground, not much scent. Rode on Pony.
Filled traps

Sat. 28th Yearby Bank. Did not do much,
very bad scent, plenty of foxes, killed
one which we found in "Hick's Whin".
Rode "Jack". Killed one.

Mon. 30th Catisty. After a lot of hard
work in cover, with a litter of cubs,
got away with an old fox at the
Shinninggrove side, took him through
Kilton wood & out by Judson's farm,
away over to "Cold Waupley", to ground
in Roxby Wood, left him & came back
to Waupley wood but did not find
again. A very stormy day. Rode "Raby"
One fall

Oct 3rd "Slape Wash." Drew "Broombe
d Bank" & rattled a good litter about
with a very bad scent in cover.
went on to "Forty Pence," found a
good litter & killed a brace, then
went on to "Waterfall" & got away
with an old fox, going as if for
Guisbro' Banks, stopped hound.
Heard that there was a fox which
had run into the Grammar school
yard at Guisbro', went & got him
& turned him down, when he ran
into W. Harrison's back yard, Guisbro'
got him and turned him down
again, when he ran into "Long
Hull" plantation, where he lay down
& Hounds killed him, very bad
scenting day. Rode "Ingleby" killed 3

Sat 5th Quisbro' Park. Drew the Whins blank & did not find until we got up to the Incline in Park wood, when we got amongst a litter of Cubs & after a lot of hard work succeeded in killing one. A very bad scent in cover, pretty fair in the open. Rode Kaby, killed one.

Mon. 7th Danby Lodge Drew Danby Crags blank, also two little covers above Danby Lodge, came back to Shelton Warren & drew it & Loombe Bank & Forty Pence blank, came on to Shelton Teller, where hounds got on to a stale line, but could do nothing, found again in "Fanny Bank" & bus fled him about when he got to ground. While drawing Forty Pence Dick found a fox

Sat. 12th Shelton Ellers, Found an
old fox in Capeton Wood & ran him
through Fanny Bank & along the bot-
tom of the Poultry House Gill, when
he turned sharp across the Park by
the kennels, then over the Guisbro'
road bearing left handed up Spout
Gill, up by the back lane farm &
over the road pointing as if for
Coombe Bank, when a long check
occured, hit him off down by the
side of Forty Pence, down by Henry
Robinson's farm across the road and
up by Capeton wood & eventually
lost him up against Upleatham
bridge, did not do much after & were

coming home & were told that our
groom had a fox in a bag, which
had been caught up in Shelton Pilla.
turned him down in the Park & killed
by Long Ace. A very wet day. Scent
very good first thing in the morning
but very bad later on. Rode Raby
killed one.

Mon. 14th Waupley New Inn. Drew The
Berks & Norby wood found plenty of
foxes & after a very bad morning's
sport killed a cub & went home. A
wet morning, not a bit of scent.
Rode Ingleby. Killed one.

Wed. 16th Paradise Farm. Drew Guistro
Banks & found foxes but could do
nothing. finished up at Shelton
Eller. A very wet & misty morning

and not a bit of scent. Rode Hard
Times. Did not kill.

Thursday 17th Cross Keys. Drew Osborne
Kush Blank & were going on to Jacksons
Plantation when a cub jumped
up on the moor in front of hounds
when they ran into him, had a
very good run afterward with an
old fox to ground, bolted him
& ran him to Upsall, where hounds
changed & our fresh fox ran them
out of scent, any amount of foxes
about. Scent was catchy. Rode Jack.
Killed one.

Feb. 19th Soapwell. Drew Upleatham
Banks round to the quarries before we
found, did not do much with our first
fox, but soon found another, and

had a nice run around by Fanny
Bank & back to Upleatham, where we had
him beat, but he some how managed
to beat us in the gardens at the Hall.
Went on to Haxelgrove & got away with
an old fox, but soon lost him
down by Mause, then went to Saltburn
Gill & found a good litter of cubs be-
low the Hagg farm, after rattling them
about got away with one & ran him
over by Saltburn wood & back again
when he beat hounds by getting
to ground. Scent was very good in
the open, Rode Raby, Ran one to ground.

Mon: 21st Layenby Station. Drew Lack-
enby Whin blank & then went to
Wallace's Whin & found a good litter
of cubs & after dusting them about
got away with one & after a short

ring killed him, drew Maggot Lane
had cover & found another good litter
of cubs, got away with one & after
running him a couple of fields he
turned short back into the cover
& would not leave again, so
hounds killed him, Went on to
Bennison's Whin & found another
good litter & hounds getting
away with the first cub that went
away, ran by Maggot Lane cover
across the marshes on to the Slag
banks, where he lay down dead
beat, the hounds getting up to
him killed him, A fair scending
day, Rode Hard Times, killed 3 foxes.

Little Moorsholm Gill into Kilton Wood,
got on to an old fox & soon killed
him, was in Kilton wood the rest of

J. P. Petchs & around by Liverton & back
into the wood, found plenty of foxes
but could do nothing with them, sent
fair in the open but bad in cover. Note

the line of a fox & getting on terms
with him, ran him very hard up to
Upleatham Bank top where the first
check occurred & some hounds getting
on ahead spoilt what would have
been a good run, they then carried
it on to Hob hill & down to Rusby
pool where he beat them. A very
good scenting day when hounds
were close to their foxes, did not kill
Kode Ingleby.

Sat. 1st Catisty. Ran a fox to ground
from Catisty in the cliff & bolted
him, when he ran back to Catisty, got
him away a second time & ran him

ms. up to the cliff. when "Waspish"
fell over & the master stopped
the hounds, got the bitch again
alive but a good deal shaken up.
Then drew Loftus wood blank &
went on to Kilton wood found
foxes, but not a bit of scent, so
came home. Did not kill, Rode ~~the~~
Neasham. This finished cub hunting
hounds having been out Twenty one
days, killing nine brace of foxes.

Mon. 3.rd Skelton Castle. A very
wet day & not a bit of scent so
hounds came home early, did not
kill, Rode Jack.

Wed. 5.th Paradise farm. Not an atom
of scent, so could do nothing &
came home early, Rode Hard Times

Sat 8th Nunthorpe. This was the first time hounds have been in this our best country, this season. Trotted away to Black Moor Plantations, & after a few minutes an old fox was viewed away & hounds getting a good start with him ran him pretty fast & round to the left when he bore away for Nunthorpe Village over Nunthorpe stall, and going around the house where hounds met, the fox was viewed coming back as if for his starting point, but being coursed by a terrier he took refuge under some stairs in a farmyard, where he was soon got out from & being allowed little saw hounds soon ran into him, Went back to Black Moor & hounds were no

sooner in than another fox
was viewed on the same side
of the cover, but being headed
he turned back & running through
the cover, broke at the same
point as our first fox, crossing
the road he pointed as if for Rychills
& Greytowers, but turning left handed
again he ran as if for Pantou & Stokes
by ~~was~~ hounds carrying a good head
& after 15 minutes came the first
check through hounds being overrode
so bad, after a longish check, hit
it off over the Stokesly road & ran
very slow up to Eastby wood after
aid, this the run was virtually all
over although hounds carried a
line up the hills & lost him
up on the moor, went down to
the Vale again & drew Rychills

At Greytowers whin blank & found
in the plantations around the house
went away by Nunthorpe Village

Mon. 16th Quisbro Park. Drove the Park
wood along to West Hills where we
found & ran him away for Wood
house farm, when he turned to the
left & we lost him close to Long Hall.
Drove Millerwood & along up the Greyhound
course, when we found close to Dunsdale
Bridge, ran him along up the course

away over for about green &
into Wilton wood, along nearby
bank & over by the new buildings
up for Upleatham, where hounds
ran him several times round
& either killed him or run him
to ground in Upleatham Pheasant
ry, but could not make out as
it was quite dark at the time
& hounds were close at him, a
very good hunting run, Node
Nelly, first time this season. Did not find out

Thurs. Medcar, Went to Benmson's
Whin first & found, ran him across
to Kinkleatham cover & as he could
not be prevailed upon to leave
again hounds killed him in
the cover, ran another fox from
the same cover to ground on

November

Warrenby marshes, found in Wallace's
whin & ran across the Marshes down
to God point & back to Warrenby
slag banks where we lost him, not
a very good scenting day. Killed
one, Node Jack.

Sat 15th Trout Hall, found a brace
of foxes in Wildgrove & got away
with one but soon lost him, Duo
clapper whin blank & went to Mary's
whin where we found & soon run
him to ground under the railway,
bolted him & ran him a ring round
to ground in the same place.
bolted him & killed him, then
went to Saltburn Gill, found
but could do nothing, then went
home, not much scent. Killed one, Node
Raby.

November

Mon. 17th Gribdale Gate. found
in Nanny how I had a very good
hunting run, ^{of about an hour} never going far away
& eventually killed him. Drew Howden
Gill & Black plantations blank &
went on to Hutton Home wood.
I found one of the right sort
at once, hounds & salted him
along by Rycliffe & along Guist's
banks when he turned on to
the moor & turning sharp to
the right, they came a clinking
pace down by the Hedder & away
across to Peay cross which he
leaves to his left, up through
Nanny how & down the hill the
other side. when he came sharp
back to the top where the first
check occurred 25 minutes to
this & no one could live with

them except W. A. E. Peare who had just got his second horse, had a longish check which proved fatal ~~to~~ as hounds could never go the same pace again, but hunted him nicely to ground in Percy Cross in about another 10 minutes, which I dont he would have reached had it not been for that check. Rode Ingleby. Killed one.

Nov. 19th Lockwood Beck, Saw Swindells & found a fox which we ran to ground above Moorsholm Village, where we left him, then drew down Moorsholm & little Moorsholm gills into Kiltonwood where we found plenty of fosses, but could not do much with them, got one away at last & ran him to ground close to Skinninggrove, where we left

it was easy to dig out, we dug the
hole out & found another besides our
hunted fox, which we turned down
in Wilton park & soon killed, then
turned the other one down & soon killed
him, then went home. A very bad
scenting day. Killed two, Rode Kaby.

Mon. 25th Slape Wath. Drew Wiley first
& found about half way up the wood, when
he ran back towards Slape Wath, he

ran through Spa wood along Belman
Banks into Guistro banks, where he
turned short back & ran much the
same line back to where we found him
& eventually lost him by Bethell Slack.
Drew Bethell Slack blank & then
went to Shelton Warren, where we killed
a fox & ran another till dark & then
came home, not much scent. Kede
Ingleby, killed one.

Thurs. 28th Kirkleatham. A hard frost &
hounds did not meet till twelve o'clock.
They did not do much as there was
little scent, but managed to kill a
fox from Adamson's Whin. I was
not out, being laid up with a sore
throat. Dick done my work & rode Heatham
killed one.

Lat 30th Saltburn, A very good scenting day
hounds ran well, but did not succeed in
getting blood. Dick rode Raby, I was not out.
Did not kill.

December

Mon. 2nd Hutton Hall, Hounds ran very
well in the morning, but came home early
in the day on account of the ground being
so hard. Harry hunted the hounds, Thutt rode
my mare Ingleby, I was not out. Did not kill.

Thurs. 5th Nunthorpe Village, Could not hunt
at Nunthorpe, so came on to Wallis's. Whin &
Kirkleatham covers, found foxes but could
not do anything, so came home, There
was a good deal of bone in the ground
Harry rode my horse "Jack". I was not out.
Did not kill.

December

Sat. 7th Court Green. Drew Guisbro
Low Park first blank, found in the
high Park, but could do nothing with
him, Drew down the Guyhound Course,
Mill Wood & Upleatham Pheasantry all
blank, then went on to New Buildings
plantations & Woodick's Whin I did
not find until hounds reached Wilton
Wood, when they ran onto Eston Park and
The Black plantation, two or three foxes
being on foot, hounds were stopped
& came home. A lot of Snow on the
hills. Dick rode my horse "Raby" Did
not kill.

Mon. 9th Loapwell. Did not do much, as there
was a lot of foxes on foot. Drew Upleatham
blank. Dick rode Ingleby. I was not out.
Did not kill.

Thurs. 12th Kilton. Was in Kilton Wood nearly the whole of the day, hounds ran very well in cover & eventually marked one to ground below Jess Hagg. Went to Mury's whin afterwards but did not find. Dick rode the grey mare. I was not out. Did not see

Sat. 14th Coatham. A very hard frosty morning, did not leave the meet until 12 O'clock, found our first fox in Bennison's whin & ran him to ground on the marshes, went back & found another & ran him across the marshes to ground in the slag banks at Eston Steelworks. found number three in Meggit lane cover & ran him to Wallace's whin, when ~~we~~ we stopped hounds as it was freezing hard & got too bad for hounds, a very poor scenting day. This was my first day out after being laid up. I rode Ingleby, did not see

December

Mon. 16th Boosbeck Station, Drew Bombe
Bank, Forty Pence, Waterfall & Capeton wood
blank, found our first fox at the bottom
of the kennel gill & ran him to ground
under the road at Upleatham, could not
dislodge him, found again on Hob hill.
& after a lot of slow hunting stopped
hounds at dark in Saltburn Gill. Frode
Raby. Did not kill.

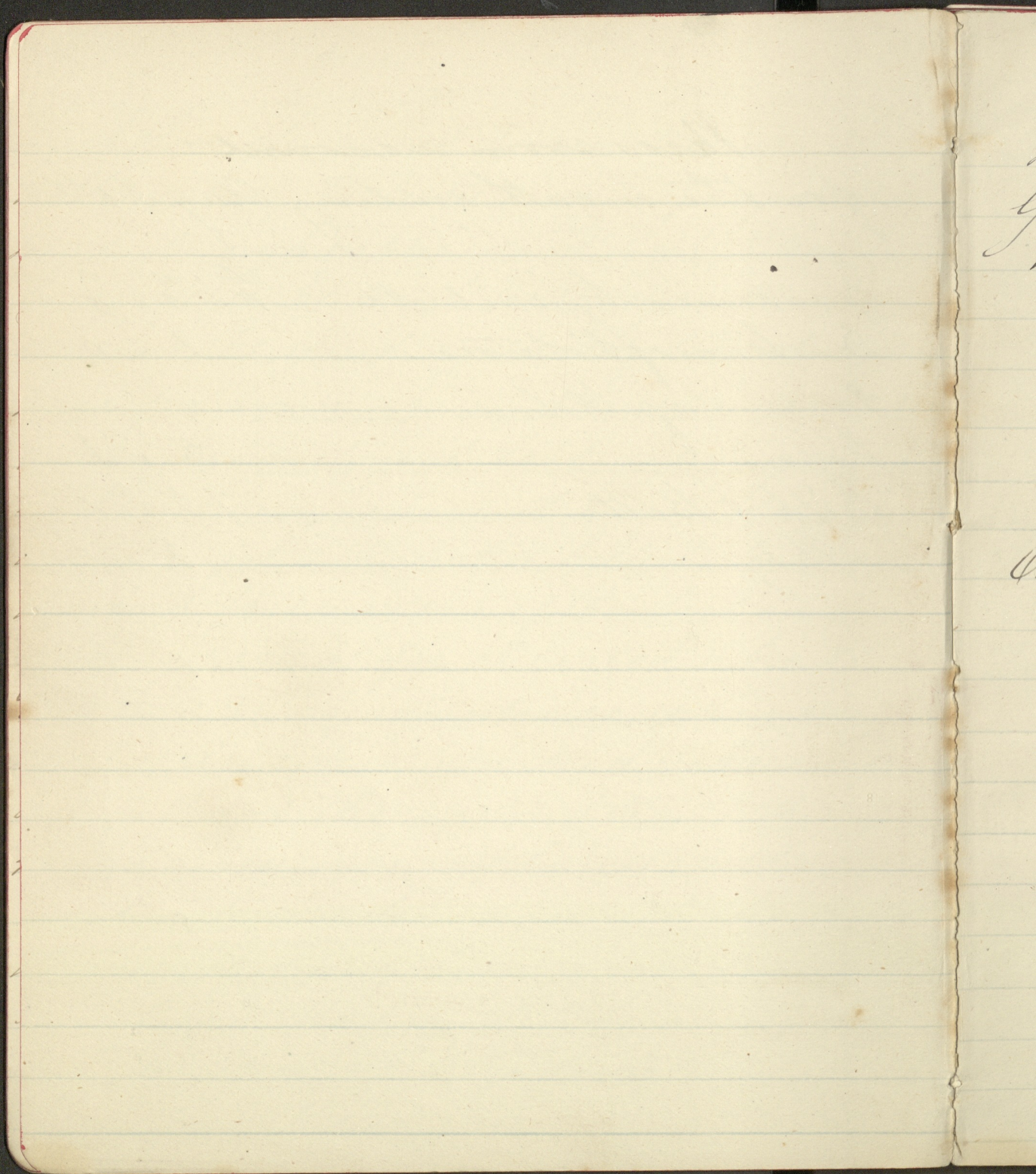
Thurs. 19th Cross Keys. Drew Osborne Rush
first blank, found in Jackson's Plantain
could not do much with him, but marked
him to ground in Osborne Rush, then
drew Upsall Wood, Eston Banks & Hick's
Whin Blank, got on to the line of a fox
that had been disturbed, & hounds be-
gan to race as if they meant business,
going through the Black Plantation
made a very sharp turn to the right

December

back through Court Green & across to Wilton wood, hounds carrying a good head, through Wilton Wood, back to Court Green, when he went to Osborne Rush sinking the wind again he turned his head for home again, when he described a similar circle & at last got to ground in the stone quarries at Court Green, where we got him out & killed him in the dark, this was one of the best runs of the season so far, it lasted about one hour & thirty minutes, excepting one check of about five minutes duration in Wilton Wood the second time round hounds were never off him & as they went a tremendous pace all the time this must have been a wonderful stout fox. He proved to be a very big old dog fox when we broke him up. Frode Jack, Killed one.
