# Key Takeaways

- USNWR formula changes:
  - Deemphasized some of W&M's strengths (graduation rate, retention rate, HS counselor rating)
  - Added metrics for areas of weakness (Pell enrollment)
- These changes resulted in:
  - Greater movement than typical, particularly between ranks 30-50
    - Pell serving public institutions gained substantially
  - Less differentiation and bigger tied groupings:
    - 2019: 10 schools scoring between 68-71
    - 2018: 7 schools scoring between 68-71

- W&M ranked 87<sup>th</sup> of 968 U.S. institutions (top 9%)
  - W&M ranked 20<sup>th</sup> of 286 institutions in the South region (top 7%)
- W&M's ranking by area improved for outcomes (65 to 57), resources (187 to 162), and environment (585 to 519); it declined for engagement (571 to 622)
- Highest scoring areas remain graduation rate, student recommendation, student engagement, and student interaction.
- Lower scoring areas remain student inclusion, subject breadth, faculty diversity, and papers per faculty.
