

Stallsbury July 28. 1817

Dear Sir

I arrived here on Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup>, after visiting the work now in train at Morris's point, within 200 yards of the boundary. I found gent. Brown here. we are just getting out for Sackville's house by Ogdensburg, which, as the roads are bad, we shall not reach in less than five days.

I saw the house, at the boundary,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of which is in Canada, & the other in the U.S. The public sentiment holds in abhorrence, such proceedings, & I have no doubt, that with suitable aid from Congress, the practice may be suppressed.

I shall hasten as rapidly as possible, to the termination of my tour, & to the seat of government. I shall write you more at length from Sackville's house -
